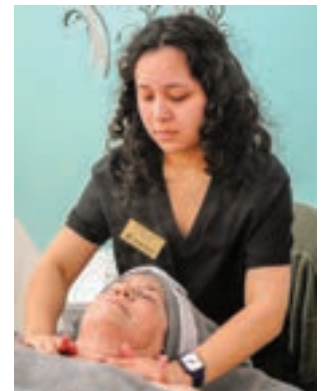

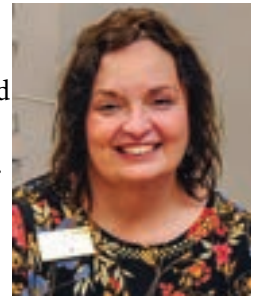

FINANCIAL AID

PCC can help you find money for college!

Pamlico Community College can help you find the money you need to pursue your educational goals! Much of the aid available for qualified students comes in the form of need-based federal Pell Grants or the new Next NC scholarships, which is a combination of federal and state funds.

Other financial aid options for curriculum students available through PCC include Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity grants and Federal Work-Study programs.

Additionally, the college has several local and institutional scholarships available for students who qualify, thanks to generous donors to the Pamlico Community College Foundation.

Unlike loans, grants and scholarships do not have to be paid back.

The first step that current and prospective students should take when applying for financial aid is to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for

Federal Student Aid) form, even if they believe they won't qualify for help.

It's important to start the process as soon as possible!

The FAFSA form helps PCC staffers determine a student's need so they can match them with possible scholarships or other federal or state financial aid options. PCC staffers are available to help students complete the FAFSA form. Once that's complete, current and prospective students are encouraged to fill out the college's scholarship application.

PCC also is able to certify for VA Education Benefits. Only eligible veterans, dependents or active duty service members who have obtained eligibility with the VA (or have received advance approval from their ESO or service if using Tuition Assistance) can utilize these benefits.

N.C. CAREER & COLLEGE PROMISE

PCC offers tuition-free college classes for high school juniors and seniors!



Juniors and seniors are eligible to take tuition-free Pamlico Community College courses while they are in high school, thanks to the N.C. Career & College Promise (CCP) program!

The credits earned by passing the college-level courses can help students get ahead and save money on a college or university education!

There are two college pathways:

- College Transfer Pathways (CTP) require the completion of at least 30 semester hours of transfer courses including English and mathematics.
- Career and Technical Education Pathways (CTE) lead to a certificate or diploma aligned with a high school career cluster.

Classes can be offered in a face-to-face format, an online format or in a combination of both.

The CCP program has been great for motivated students who want to get ahead in their college/university studies or who want to get started on their careers.

The CCP program is open to local students, regardless of whether they attend Pamlico County High School, Arapahoe Charter School, Pamlico Christian Academy or a home school!

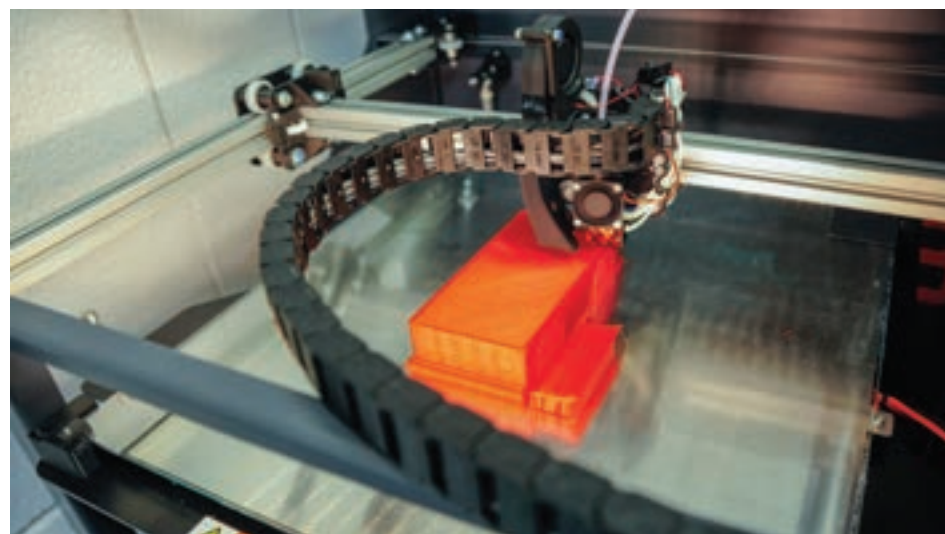
